



Abbreviations

KB1 - knit in the back loop of the stitch

PB1 - purl in the back loop of the stitch

Explaining K1B:

KB1 is the abbreviation for: knit one in the; back loop of the stitch

Insert one needle (right needle) into the back loop of the stitch on the left needle (Knit Stitch).

Wind the yarn over the right hand needle.

Draw the right needle and yarn through the stitch and transfer the loop onto the right needle.

PB1 - Will be the same as above, just by purling the stitch in the back loop of the stitch (yarn will be in the front when you purl).

MULTIPLES OF 2 + 1

Size:

7 1/2" x 7 1/2" appx

4 rows = 1/2" appx

Border top/bottom = 1/4" each

1 set [1-8 rows] = 1 1/4"

EMBOSSED CHECK DISHCLOTH PATTERN

Cast on 35 stitches with 3.5 mm needles

Knit 4 rows

Pattern

1st Row (RS) **K2**, ***KB1*** repeat * to * to last 4 stitches, **K2**
 2nd Row: **K2, K1** ***PB1, K1***; repeat from * to * to last 4 stitches, **K2**
 3rd Row (RS): **K2, P1** ***KB1, P1***; repeat from * to * to last 4 stitches, **K2**
 4th Row: As 2nd row;
 5th Row (RS): As 1st row;
 6th Row: **K2, PB1**, ***K1, PB1***; repeat from * to * to last 4 stitches, **K2**
 7th Row (RS): **K2, KB1**, ***P1, KB1***; repeat from * to * to last 4 stitches, **K2**
 8th Row: As 6th row;

Repeat rows 1-8 five more times [Total of 6 sets]

Purl 2 rows and then bind off using purl method
